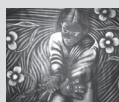
6 Carlton Street between 11th & 12th Streets

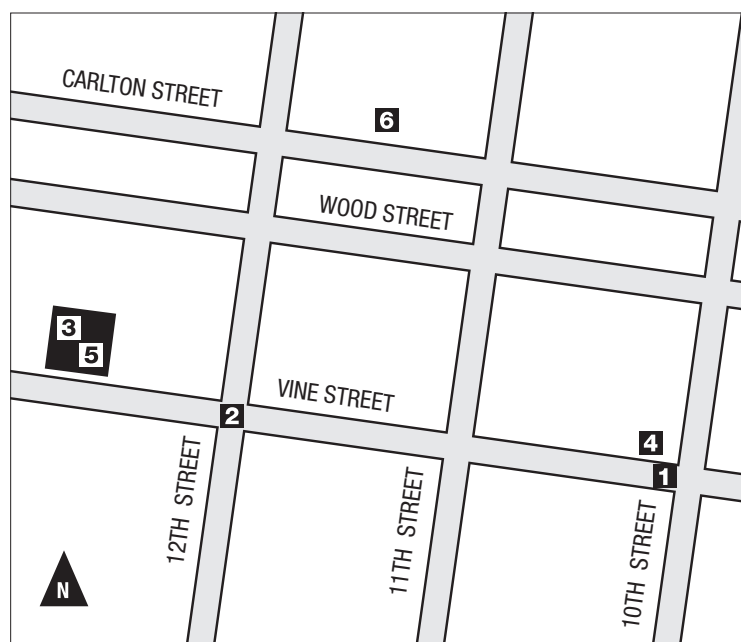
